## AFL Penrith Cup (Non-competitive)

Dear Parents and Carers,

**Details:** Penrith Cup will be held on **Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> November** at **Jamison Park, Penrith** where students will participate in AFL. Penrith Cup is a non-competitive event with an emphasis on students learning the games and utilising skills learnt during weekly sport sessions.

We will be assembling teams of 12 players to allow for substitutions and to accommodate any player illness on the day. We are taking two Stage 2 (Year 3 and 4) teams and two Stage 3 (Year 5 and 6) teams. Teams will be formed on a first-come, first-served basis, prioritising the timely return of both permissions and payments. Permit and pay options will cease once teams are full.

All students will be training each Friday at school as part of the weekly sport program, in the lead up to the event.

**Classes involved:** Stage 2 and 3 classes

**When:** 5<sup>th</sup> November 2024

**Travel:** Bus

**Cost:** \$10

**Note:** Students will be required to wear full sport uniform and joggers. Football boots are optional.

**What to Bring:** recess, lunch, water

**What to wear:** Full school uniform must be worn including a school hat and comfortable walking shoes such as sneakers. (include wet weather or specified clothing)

In accordance with our discipline policy, if your child is on Orange Level, he/she will not be able to attend. Please fill out the permission slip below and return to the school office with your payment.

**Payments and permission can be given through the Sentral Parent Portal. There is no need to return the note if this option is chosen.** Please contact the office if you do not use Sentral Parent Portal and need access.
