Penrith Cup Soccer 2024 – Term 3

Dear Parents and Carers,

Penrith Cup will be held on **Tuesday 13th August** at **Jamison Park, Penrith** where students will participate in Soccer. Penrith Cup is a non-competitive event with an emphasis on students learning the games and utilising skills learnt during weekly sport sessions.

The Soccer Penrith Cup will be limited to 2 teams per stage. Each Soccer team requires 11 players on the field. We will be assembling teams of 15 players to allow for substitutions and accommodate any player illness on the day. Therefore, our participation for this Penrith Cup is capped at 30 Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4) players and 30 Stage 3 (Years 5 & 6) players. All students have an equal opportunity to participate as team players on the day. Teams will be formed on a first-come, first-served basis, prioritising the timely return of notes and payment. Each team will be training each Friday at school in the lead up to the event.

The cost is \$10.

Students will be required to wear the school sports uniform including hat and joggers. Students will also be required to wear shin pads and long socks.

Football/soccer boots are not permitted.

Students will need to pack lunch and water for the day as there will be no canteen facilities. Parents are welcome to come and watch this event. The day starts at 9.30am and will finish by 2.00pm to allow time for return to school at the end of the normal school day.

Payments and permission can be given through the Sentral Parent Portal. There is no need to return the note if this option is chosen. Please contact the office if you do not use Sentral Parent Portal and need access.

Payments can also be made in the school office by Cash and EFTPOS. All payments made through the office must be in a clearly marked envelope with child's name, class and activity. All payments and permissions are to be completed **no later than Friday 9th August 2024**. If you need to make payment arrangements, please contact the office before this date.

In accordance with our discipline policy, if your child is on Orange Level, they will not be able to attend this event.

Personal injury statement

In the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity. The Department's public liability cover is fault-based and limited to breaches by the Department of its duty of care to students that may result in claims for compensation.

Parents/Carers are advised to assess the level and extent of their child's involvement in the sport program offered by the school, school sport zone, region, state school sport associations when deciding whether additional insurance cover is required prior to their child's involvement in the program. Personal accident insurance cover is available through normal retail outlets.

The NSW Supplementary Sporting Injury Benefits Scheme, funded by the NSW Government, provides limited cover for serious injury resulting in the permanent loss of a prescribed faculty or loss of the use of certain prescribed parts of the body.
